This is apparent hen reading this eeks Torah portion Shelah Send agents to sco t the land of hich I am gi ing to the Israelite people Canaan e read as e open the parsha N m Whereas God generall told Moses hat to do here He imb ed Moses ith the a thorit to select leaders for this reconnaissance mission from each of the t el e tribes send one participant *ish* ehad. ish ehad from each of their ancestral tribes each one a chief *nasi* among them The erse stresses both the sing larit of each leader ithin his tribe and the gro p as a hole hom st ork together as one

Rashi e plains that each one as a leader among them Seforno adds that the indi id al selected had to be the best leader from his tribe one ho co ld recogni e the signi cance of the land For Rashi it s a leader For Seforno it s *the* leader Moses needed to think er caref ll abo t the q alities of each person and the composition of the gro p Select the rong people or the right indi id als b t not a prod cti e combination of them and the mission o ld fail And the mission did fail The Torah names each person selected according to his tribe These men had a historic role People long into the f t re o ld need to kno their names Each of these leaders carried the important task of e al ating the land according to Moses speci c objecti es See hat kind of co ntr it is N m he told them

Moses concl ded ith one req est And take pains to bring back some of the fr it of the land It as the grape har est season Seeing is belie ing When the people sa the s eet and large fr it the old be impressed and feel moti ated to complete the jorne ith enth siasm The tribal leaders ere to g re this ot together and present one report

Nahmanides onders h Moses sent o t the mission in the rst place It as a risk If the report as negati e as Moses going to take the people back to Eg pt Certainl not Nahmanides e plains that the Israelites anted a gro p to reconnoiter the land as a standard proced re of militar connoiter
